



“Mongolian Heritage Spread Across the World” A 20-Volume Catalogue Project discussion held

On September 10, discussion and introduction of ‘Mongolian heritage spread around the world’ program was held at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Countries around the world are engaged in studying, promoting collaboration in, initiating discussions on, photocopying and reproducing their own heritage assets that

are related to their cultural heritages. Publication of heritage assets that are kept not only in Mongolia but also in other countries across the world is extremely important for extensively studying the history and culture of Mongolia, supplementing them with new materials and original sources, expanding their research base and subsequently elevating their research to new a higher level. Collaborative research efforts undertaken by Mongolia in recent years have set in motion study into the traces of heritage assets related to Mongolia that are to be found in different countries around the world, which give confidence in the viability of its implementation. This means that monuments, documents, historical sites, tangible and non-tangible historical, cultural and traditional heritages of Mongolia found outside of the country would be researched in a systematic manner, reproduced and fully registered.

The 20-volume Catalogue “Mongolian Heritage Scattered Across the World” Project pursues the objective of making an inventory of Mongolian heritage assets found and kept in all the countries of the world. The following actions are planning under the Project:

- Systematically identify heritage assets related to the history, cultural customs and traditions of Mongolia and conduct scientifically based research into them;
- Create an integrated inventory and develop an electronic information repository;
- Identify and publish researches carried out into historical and cultural monuments having direct and collateral relationship to Mongolia;
- Foster collaboration among Mongolian and foreign scholars, researchers, interested people, governmental and non-governmental organizations; and,
- Promote and publicize heritage assets found in

Mongolia and elsewhere around the world both inside and outside the country.
